



Fortune Asia Poker® is based on the game “Chinese Poker” you get seven cards to make three poker hands:

- Four Card Hand
- Two Card Hand
- One Card Hand

The only rule for setting your hands is that your four-card hand must be higher than your two-card hand, and your two-card hand must be higher than your one-card hand.

The dealer must set their hand according to the specified house way. Each of your three hands will match up against the dealer’s corresponding hands. You must win 2+ hands to win or 2+ hands to lose.

Fortune Asia Poker also offers the optional Fortune Bonus and progressive wagers.

GETTING STARTED

Make the mandatory Fortune Asia Poker wager. You may also make the Fortune Bonus and progressive wagers.

You will receive your seven cards and arrange them into the four-card (high) hand, two-card (mid) hand and one-card (low) hand. After setting your hands, place them in the marked areas.

Once all player’s hands have been set in the proper area, the dealer will reveal and set their hands.

WINNING & LOSING

If you beat the dealer in at least two of the matchups, your Fortune Asia Poker wager wins. If you lose to the dealer in at least two of the matchups, your Fortune Asia Poker wager will lose.

Note: The house wins ties.

The dealer will reconcile your Fortune Bonus and progressive wagers at the same time as your Fortune Asia Poker wager.

FORTUNE BONUS

The Fortune Bonus wager wins if your seven card hand matches one of the posted Fortune Bonus hands. If you wager at least \$5 on the Fortune Bonus, the dealer will place an “Envy” button next to your bet. This qualifies you for a bonus payout when any other player at the table has at least a four-of-a-kind or higher. See payable for odds.

Note: You cannot envy the dealer’s hand or your hand.

PROGRESSIVE

The progressive bet qualifies you for payouts from the progressive jackpot. See payable for odds.
