Meritage is a word used to distinguish wines that are made in a similar style as the red wines from Bordeaux France. Red wine from Bordeaux are made with certain grape varieties, principally Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, and Malbec. A red Meritage must be made from at least two of these grapes. Winemakers must license the right to use the trademark "Meritage" for their wines from The Meritage Association, based in California.
