COMMUNITY GIVING CRITERIA BY CATEGORY



I. Youth programs which encourage:

- Education
- Character development
- O Basic needs for low-income children

A. Support

- In-kind support for Grades K-7 in Temecula Valley
- Financial support for schools within the Unified School Districts of Temecula Valley, Murrieta Valley, and Elsinore Valley
- Youth development organizations that are open to the general public
- Community sports organizations that are open to all youth within the age group of 4-17 (i.e. Little Leagues, AYSO, etc.) – Funding is for the league only; sponsorship of individual teams is not permitted.

B. Decline

- K-12 schools outside of the Unified School Districts of Temecula Valley, Murrieta Valley, and Elsinore Valley
- Four-year colleges
- Private schools
- Child care centers
- Club sports, travel teams, individual team support
- Education loans, endowments, or fellowships
- Scholarship awards in the name of another

organization

• Inaugural programs

*Note: Local high schools receiving an annual gift will not be considered for additional funding in that same fiscal year for individual programs or booster clubs.

II. Community programs focusing on:

- Basic needs such as shelter, food, and clothing for lowincome families
- o Essential services for low-income senior citizens
- o Military families
- Veterans



A. Support

- Food banks and temporary shelters, with priority given to organizations within close proximity of Pechanga.
- Military family support
- For national organizations, support will go to the nearest organization closest to Pechanga (i.e. Kiwanis, Rotary, Soroptimists, etc.)
- Pre-selected health causes, determined in advance annually by the community outreach committee.

B. Decline

- Legal services and/or programs
- Professional sporting sponsorship (i.e. motocross, boxing, horse riding, etc.)
- Club, adult, or for-profit sporting events or teams
- Sectarian or denominational religious organizations, such as churches, missionary groups or funds, unless the program is widely promoted, available to the public, and free from religious orientation
- Fine arts programs (Museums, theater, etc.)
- Animal causes
